Parent/carer consent for exemption and withdrawal

In May 2021 the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be completed by all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. NAPLAN will assess the literacy and numeracy learning of students in all Australian schools.

The results of the tests will provide important information to schools about what each student can do and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement and will be able to compare their child's performance against the national minimum standard.

Students may be withdrawn from the tests at the request of their parent/carer.

Exemption must be discussed with the principal.

Consideration for exemption can be given to students:

- with a language background other than English who arrived in Australia less than a year before the tests; or
- with significant intellectual disability and/or significant co-existing conditions that severely limit their capacity to participate in the tests (the level of adjustment reported for the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) must be recorded).
